Irish literature comprises writings in the Irish, Latin, and English (including Ulster Scots) languages on the island of Ireland. The earliest recorded Irish writing dates from the seventh century and was produced by monks writing in both Latin and Early Irish. In addition to scriptural writing, the monks of Ireland recorded both poetry and mythological tales. There is a large surviving body of Irish mythological writing, including tales such as *The Táin* and *Mad King Sweeny*. A second Irish dimension in Anglo-Irish literature of the period may be detected in the cross-fertilizations of language. At their most basic level, these cross-fertilizations produced Hiberno-English "the barbarous denominations" of the Irish brogue, as Swift had it, from which an Englishman expected nothing but "bulls, blunders, and follies."
