One of the first sociological approaches to health and ill health involves the functionalist approach. The functionalist approach is derived from the work of Talcott Parsons. Using the traditional functionalist approach he described how for society to function effectively that its members need to be healthy. Parsons defined illness as a form of deviance and that ill members of society were still performing a social role, the sick role. In his view if people declared themselves as ill specific rights and responsibilities come with this new role. What social factors account for health disparities across socially defined groups? • What factors account for the spread and patterning of HIV/AIDS in Africa? What factors should inform our efforts at intervention? • How might we think of social policy as health policy? How can these connections be made more transparent? • The U.S. spends more on health care than any other country, yet ranks near the bottom in health among its peer nations. • How and why are social problems, “deviant” behavior and statuses, and even common conditions and behaviors defined as medical conditions?
