A well-managed classroom environment provides students with a consistent, safe setting where expectations for appropriate behaviors are clearly stated and consistently reinforced. Such settings allow students to develop a sense of trust and comfort with all members of the classroom community. A teacher can use numerous strategies to manage their classroom and offer students the opportunity to build their knowledge and also to prevent misbehavior in classroom. To set up rules in the classroom it is important to have a good classroom management and have small numbers of students inside the classroom. In Hyme's view, a person who acquires communicative competence acquires both knowledge and ability for language use with respect to Class-wide incentives: Because low-level disruption can be endemic and stress-inducing as well as a potential launching pad for more problematic classroom behaviours, interventions focusing on the whole class can be more effective than targeting individuals. There are numerous programmes in the research literature, including token economies and prize draws to increase appropriate behaviours. Competitions such as the Good Behaviour Game (Barrish, Saunders & Wolf, 1969; Harris & Sherman, 1973; Kleinman & Saigh, 2011; Medland & Stachnik, 1972), noise reduction programmes using fee
