For many years, study of the Restoration decades has been a poor relation in writing on the Stuart age.Â The habit of defining an age or character through parallel biographies goes back at least to Plutarch, but in Restoration studies the pairing Milton-Bunyan is more common. N.H. Keeble, though acknowledging their social difference, emphasizes the literary and religious similarity of Milton and Bunyan, as twin pillars of nonconformism; Rochester features solely as a flat, allegorical personification of the Restoration Court culture abhorred by the godly (Keeble, 1987: 18, 20â€”2, 218 andpassim).
