Asenath Nicholson Annals of the Famine in Ireland, in 1847, 1848 and 1849 –“The morning was unusually sunny but the horrors of that day were inferior to none ever witnessed. The road was rough, and we constantly were meeting pale, meagre-looking men, who were on their way from the mountains to break stones and pile them mountain high for the paltry compensation of a pound of meal a day”
