The Church of England is the established Christian church in England and the mother church of the worldwide Anglican Communion. The church dates its establishment to the 6th-century Gregorian mission in Kent led by St Augustine. The English church renounced papal authority when Henry VIII broke with Rome to secure an annulment from Catherine of Aragon in the 1530s. The English Reformation accelerated under Edward VI's regents before a brief restoration of Catholicism under Queen Mary I and Philip II. The English Church is split from Rome. When the Pope refused to grant Henry VIII a divorce* from Catherine of Aragon, Henry split off the English Church from the Roman church. Rather than the pope, the king would be the spiritual head of the English church. (Reformation). Despite being cut off from Rome, England, retained much of the doctrine and the practices of Catholicism. Why did Henry VIII break with Rome? Henry VIII broke with Rome because the pope in Rome would not grant him a divorce with his wife, Catherine of Aragon, because divorce was against church policy. It was under Elizabeth that the Anglican church (Church of England) became firmly established and dominant. However, Elizabeth did her best to sort out the problem of religion.
