The American prison system is massive. So massive that its estimated value of \$74 billion per year eclipses the GDP of 133 nations. Since the 1970s federal and state correction agencies have consistently struggled to meet the increased demands brought on by the US Department of Justice and strict drug laws. In 1982, three Texas businessmen, Tom Beasley, John Ferguson, and Don Hutto saw an opportunity in the shortcomings of the Texas corrections system's inability to deal with this influx of incarcerations. Hutto, Ferguson and Beasley formed Corrections Corporation of America, the largest prison private prison network in the United States.
