After the Middle Ages, one of the most important English guilds of surgeons merged with a guild of barbers, creating barber-surgeons. There were specialists of various types, including dentists and others. They might have included surgeons who never went through apprenticeship, but were trained to dress battle wounds. Not all dramas were 'religious' in the modern Christian sense of the word, and several had a non-religious story to tell. But there was a strong belief in ancient Greece that actions of men and many things that happened by or to them were the result of the direct intervention or of the goodwill or badwill of one of the gods. Drama was introduced to England from Europe by the Romans, and auditoriums were constructed across the country for this purpose. By the medieval period, the mummers' plays had developed, a form of early street theatre associated with the Morris dance, concentrating on themes such as Saint George and the Dragon and Robin Hood. These were folk tales re-telling old stories, and the actors travelled from town to town performing these for their audiences in return for money and hospitality.
